# **HEAD MASTER'S** THIRTEENTH ANNUAL REPORT.

Mr. President, Dr. and Mrs. R. T. Patton, Ladies and Gentlemen, Members of the Staff, Boys and Girls. have much pleasure in presenting this, the Thirteenth Annual Report of the Dandenong High School,

I desire at the outset to thank Dr. and Mrs. Patton for their kindness in helping us with our annual function this afternoon. Dr. Patton is not only a personal friend of several members of the staff, but is keenly interested in education generally, and it is with pleasure that we welcome him and Mrs. Patton here this afternoon.

When we assembled last year the Boomerang Theatre the financial and economic outlook was anything cheerful. Unemployment was but rife, and those pupils who had completed their High School course and were ready to commence their life's work were fored with an acute short-

were ready to commence their the st work were faced with an acute shortage of positions, and a consequent surplus of applicants for all branches of employment. I do not desire strike a pessimistic note, but we cannot deny the fact that the position is still unsatisfactory. Those boys and girls who left in 1930 in many cases are still unemployed, and those who leave this year will swell the ranks of applicants for positions. The most unfortunate position is that some, under existing conditions, find themselves too close to the time when the basic wage must operate, and employers will not give employment to such applicants whose qualifications may be excellent, but whose age excludes them. In times such as these, would it not be advantageous to temporarily suspend the operations the Apprenticeship Act, and so move a most serious block to employment. This might necessitate special legislation, but surely in the interests of the youth of the community -t is worth while attempting to do something for those who find their chances gradually slipping from them.

The enrolment this year is what less than last year, and this is due to two main causes: (a) The prefinancial difficulty precluding sent parents from paying train fares, fees. etc.; and (b) the entrance examination for ex-VI. Grade pupils before ad-We have on the roll this mission. year 421 pupils, compared with 470 last year.. This year marked a change in policy forecasted in our last port. Honors pupils were required to transfer to inner Metropolitan High Schools, and we thus lost some very fine pupils. The system has now seen on trial for twelve months, and may So far as be continued next year. can be ascertained at present Honors candidates will be required to enrol at a Melbourne school for next year. Parents who need to comply with this condition should make application for enrolment at the new schools as soon as possible.

The pupils in the 1930 examination maintained the good results of those

maintained the good results of those who had preceded them. Thirty-two pupils obtained the Intermediate Certificate (list given elsewhere). In the Leaving Certificate examination, eight pupils obtained a complete pass, while 10 others may complete subsequently. Two candidates obtained Second-class Honors; 68 obtained the Merit Certificate, and 85 out of 90 obtained the I.O.R. Certificate. In the Commercial section 13 out of 15 passed in Advanced Typewriting, 15 out of 15 in Advanced Shorthand Theory; 10 obtained a certificate for a speed of 80 words per minute; 10 for 100 w.p.m.; and two, 120 w.p.m. Five out of seven candidates obtained a Pitman's certificate for 80 or 90 w.p.m. In this connection, we desire to thank Mr. T. James for his help in supervising this examination. Forty-three candidates obtained the Senior Swimming Certificate, and 53 the Junior; seven càndidates obtained the Education Department's medallion.

In the Metropolitan High Schools Sports' Association we achieved a fair measure of success. Our girls' tennis team for the first time won the Tennis Shield. beating University School in the final match, and hockey team succeeded in retaining tae trophy in this sport. Hocking was the captain of each team. The cricket and football teams achieved some measure of success. while the newly formed lacrosse team acquitted themselves well. One of our pupils, Thelma Hocking, was a member of the Interstate Hockey team, which played in the series in Brisbane. This is a distinction which is probably unique in the history of High School sport. In the competition with Warragul we succeeded in retaining the A.N.A. Shield for another twelve months. The E2 Form won the basketball shield, defeating Dandenong West school in the final match. The school again won the Dandenong Horticultural Cup at the Autumn show. At the Diggers' carnival we won the junior girls' basketball passing and the junior boys' flag race. In the Metropolitan High School

In the Metropolitan High School Sports Association, Thelma Hocking won the senior girls' championship. The tennis championships for provided some very fine contests. In the girls' section Thelma Hocking won Joan Thomson, while Don Hooper defeated Tom Rothfield in the boys' division. These four pupils were the finalists for 1930, with exactly the same results. Thelma Hocking has now won the cup on two occassions; Don Hooper has been successful four times, three of them in succession.

The competition for first positions among the Houses was very keen. The section which carries most points is that of scholarship. The House winning this division has an undoubted advantage, and rightly so. This year the points were as follow: Clematis, 24 1-3 points: Orchid, 26 5-6 points; Wattle, 31 5-6 points; Bluegum, 53 points. We desire to congratulate the Bluegum House on its achievement.

The Old Pupils' Association is still a very live force, due in great measure to the inspiration given by its president, Mr. James Sharkie, and its secretary, Mr. Arhtur Butler. The function on Show Day has been the means of bringing together old pupils are scattered all over the State. The tennis tournament and the evening social are special features. This year the tennis tournament was won by Mr. W. Brodie and Miss A. Bowser from Mr. B. Russell and Miss J. Thomson. The secretary would be pleased to enrol new members from those leaving this year. The prizes offered by the O.P.A. were won by Marjorie Herbert and Stanley Kirk.

The school has suffered severely this year in the loss by death of three of its old boys. Guy Halahan, a very fine ex-student and enthusiastic member of the Old Pupils' Association, after a somewhat protracted illness passed away in the early part of the year. Later, by the tragic deaths of Maurice Chambers and Lawrence Lalor, who were on a holiday trip to the Gippsland Lakes, the school lost two very fine young men of a type

two very fine young men of a type that can ill be spared. We extend to the relatives of them all our heartfelt sympathy.

Under the guidance of Miss Banks, the Penny Savings Bank has continued its good work in spite of the financial depression. We have about the same number of depositors, although the total of deposits is somewhat smaller than last year. Encouragement of a thrifty spirit is particularly advantageous in times such

as me present.

The J.R.C. has been very active all the year. The members collected boots and shoes for the Florence Nightingale Day, eggs for the Alfred Hospital, helped with the stall for the local Hospital, and F Form girls assisted in making and distributing flannel garments to families of unemployed. The circle also sent a donafunds of the J.R.C. to the tion Almoner, who is to follow up cases of infantile paralysis. We also forwarded a Christmas gift for the Deaf and Dumb and Blind children. cookery girls again contributed the ingredients and made the Christmas pudding for the Talbot Colony of Epileptics.

The fifth volume of the School Magazine was published during the third term. The editors, Don Hooper and Marjorie Herbert, are to be congratulated on the result of their efforts. Miss Steel deserves the best thanks of the school for the amount of time and effort spent by her in its

preparation.
